Christian Service Project for the Gold Medal of Achievement

Introduction:

What is the difference between the GMA Christian Service Project and the Christian service activities required for the Bronze and Silver medals? The two service activities did not require you to be a leader of a major project, only a participant. It is now up to you to show initiative, determination, and follow through. In fact, your service project could help other Royal Rangers complete their Christian service activity hours. Read the information provided below to begin thinking and planning your Gold Medal of Achievement Christian Service Project. A Project Workbook is provided in your Adventure Rangers Workbook to help you organize, plan, and track the progress of your project.

Project Scope:

The Christian Service Project must be of benefit to your church, schools or community. The workbook will give you a step by step plan to follow and will include: Fact-finding to determine need, resources required and available, pictures before and after the project is completed, consultation with leaders and those benefiting from project, logging of project hours and individuals working on the project.

There are no time or size requirements recommended for the project. However, it must provide you with an opportunity to demonstrate and further develop your leadership skills. Your commander or outpost council member can assist you in determining an appropriate project. You may begin work on this project as soon as you have earned you Silver Medal.

Project Examples:

Your project does not have to be original. It could be something someone else has done before. It does, however, have to be initiated and planned by you! Listed below are some examples to help you begin thinking about what you might do. But don't let this list limit the possibilities. You know your church and community well enough to understand its needs, so go out and find a need and fulfill it.

- Organize and run a bike safety check and rodeo.
- Design and implement a plan to landscape the church.
- Consult with the pastor or church board to help design or paint the appropriate parking spaces for the handicapped.
- Plan, organize, and implement a plan to provide an after school tutoring or activity program.
- Build or repair playground equipment at a local park or school.

Project Limitation:

The project may not be a fundraiser or business venture. Fundraising is limited to obtaining materials and supplies for the project.

Brief Outline:

Before starting –

- □ Earn the Silver Medal
- □ Consult with your commander or outpost council member. Get an approval.
- □ Consult with the director of the benefiting group to get their approval.

Describe the project –

- □ Define the purpose of the project.
- □ Write a general description of the project.
- □ Include a project schedule.

Materials Required -

- □ Make a list of the materials needed.
- □ Determine the cost of the materials needed.
- □ Plan the fundraising if it is required.

Project Schedule –

- ☐ Make a list of the major tasks needed to complete the project.
- □ Make an estimate of the number of hours needed to complete the project.
- □ Estimate the number of workers needed; assign workers to tasks.

Project Review -

- □ Present the completed project's records, photographs, and workbook to your commander or outpost council member for final approval.
- □ Give examples of how you were the project leader.
- □ Explain or give examples of how you learned or developed new leadership skills.
- ☐ If adjustments had to be made to the original plan, explain why they were made.
- □ Describe the problems were encountered during the project, if any, and how they were solved?
